

**Oxnard, CA:** Sunny and partly cloudy with highs in the 70s and lows in the low 60s.



Growers are reporting limited supplies out of the Pacific Northwest and Mexico. Growers in Mexico are forecasting increased supplies in the weeks to come.</li> <li>Blueberries: ALERT Prices for Blueberries are trending up. Production is coming down out of the Pacific Northwest. The season is well past the peak. Quality is good.</li> <li>Raspberries: Prices for Raspberries are trending down. Growers are reporting limited supplies out of the Pacific Northwest and Mexico. Growers in Mexico are forecasting increased supplies in the weeks to come.</li> </ul>
<u>Broccoli</u>	<u>SUPPLY</u> FAIR <u>QUALITY</u> GOOD	<ul> <li>Broccoli: Supplies continue to be fair with good quality. Supplies are available from Salinas, Santa Maria, and Mexico. Lower yields are being reported due to summer defects and growing gaps. Market pricing for Broccoli has increased and is expected to remain strong for a few weeks. (F.O.B. pricing for this week \$17.00 - \$18.00)</li> <li>Broccolini: Supplies continue to be very good. Demand has slowed down. Supplies are expected to continue improving. Supplies should be steady for the next few weeks. Great time to promote Broccolini. (F.O.B. pricing for this week \$21.95 - \$22.75)</li> </ul>
MARKET ALERT Brussels Sprouts	<u>SUPPLY</u> FAIR <u>QUALITY</u> FAIR	Supplies continue to be light with fair quality. Demand is strong. Market pricing and contracts will remain escalated. Supplies will remain light causing markets to remain high and prices continue to remain escalated. (F.O.B. pricing for this week \$48.00 - \$50.00)
Cabbages	<u>SUPPLY</u> GOOD <u>QUALITY</u> GOOD	Supplies are steady with good quality. Growers are reporting better availability. Market pricing has improved. Products are coming from Salinas and Santa Maria. (F.O.B. pricing for this week \$12.00 - \$14.00)
Cantaloupes	<u>SUPPLY</u> FAIR <u>QUALITY</u> GOOD	The cantaloupe market had been trending higher for the past couple of weeks with limited availability, especially in the smaller sizes. Primary sizing are 9/9J. Brix is good.











MARKET ALERT Herbs	<u>Supply</u> Fair <u>Quality</u> Fair	Mexican production has improved. The availability and quality of most herbs are still impacted by rain in Colombia. Domestic and Mexican options are available on the east coast. <b>Cilantro: ALERT</b> Supplies are limited and quality is fair. Market pricing has escalated. Supplies are now shipping out of Salinas and Santa Maria. Growers are reporting lower yields. Growers are reporting market conditions to continue for a few weeks. (F.O.B. pricing for this week \$20.00 - \$22.00)
Honeydews	<u>SUPPLY</u> GOOD <u>QUALITY</u> GOOD	Honeydew supplies are steady. Sizing profile has shifted to 5/5J causing 6/8s to be limited. Quality is good with high brix level.
Iceberg	<u>SUPPLY</u> GOOD <u>QUALITY</u> GOOD	Supplies are good with improved quality. The weight is expected to improve and lettuce heads will be back to normal. Yield is looking better, causing markets to improve. Market pricing is lower and expected to continue improving. Great time to promote iceberg lettuce. (F.O.B. pricing for this week \$12.00 - \$13.00)
Kale	<u>SUPPLY</u> GOOD <u>QUALITY</u> GOOD	Supplies are steady with good quality and demand. Supplies should remain steady for a few weeks. Market pricing is steady. (F.O.B. pricing for this week \$11.65 - \$13.65)
Leaf	<u>SUPPLY</u> GOOD <u>QUALITY</u> GOOD	<ul> <li>Green &amp; Red Leaf: Supplies are good with fair quality and heavy insect presence due to warm weather. Sizing and carton weights are good. Markets and supplies to remain steady for the next few weeks. (Green Leaf F.O.B pricing for this week \$11.00 - \$12.00)(Red Leaf F.O.B. pricing for this week \$10.00 - \$11.00)</li> <li>Romaine: Supplies are very good with good quality and heavy. Insect presence due to warm weather. Carton weights are good. Expect market pricing to be steady along with supplies. Great time to promote Romaine. (Romaine F.O.B pricing for this week \$11.00 - \$12.00) (Hearts F.O.B pricing for this week \$14.00 - \$16.00)</li> <li>Tender Leaf: Supplies are good with good demand. Quality is fair to good. Supplies and availability are improving due to better weather. Steady Market pricing and supplies are to be expected in the next few weeks. (F.O.B. pricing for this week \$4.75 - \$5.00)</li> </ul>

Mushrooms	<u>SUPPLY</u> FAIR <u>QUALITY</u> GOOD	Mushrooms supplies have improved in the last few months. Growers are reporting better availability across the mushroom category. Price increases seem to have stabilized. Markets are expected to remain steady.
Onions	<u>SUPPLY</u> GOOD <u>QUALITY</u> GOOD	Quality is good with steady demand. The market is steady. All colors and sizes are shipping out of the Northwest. Colorado is expected to start after Labor Day. Wisconsin is starting to harvest and will continue until the end of the year, while Utah will begin harvesting in early fall. Transportation has been a bit of a challenge for some in the Northwest. Freight is slightly higher in the Northwest. This will also have an impact on precut.
MARKET ALERT	<u>SUPPLY</u> FAIR <u>QUALITY</u> FAIR	<b>EXTREME</b> Supplies will be very limited for the next few weeks. Hurricane caused heavy rains and extreme wind conditions resulting in damage to the crops. Current supplies are coming from Mexico. The market will be escalated for the next few weeks. Expect fair quality for the next few weeks. (F.O.B. pricing for this week \$33.00 - \$35.00)
Peppers Bell	<u>SUPPLY</u> FAIR <u>QUALITY</u> GOOD	Prices for Green Bell Peppers are stable. Red and Yellow Bell Peppers are trending up. Production is coming out of Michigan and Local Programs in the Northeast. Growers are currently reporting steady supplies. Color Bell Peppers continue to be on the tighter side.
MARKET ALERT Peppers Chili	<u>SUPPLY</u> POOR <u>QUALITY</u> POOR	Prices for Chili Peppers are trending down slightly. Prices are still extremely escalated. Growers are expecting the market to remain tight for another 4 weeks.
MARKET ALERT Pineapples	<u>SUPPLY</u> FAIR <u>QUALITY</u> GOOD	Pineapple continues to be extremely tight, particularly in 5ct and 6ct. Crownless pineapples have also tightened up. 8ct pineapples still available. In September, the size curve is likely to shift again toward larger fruit. Advise to be flexible on sizing at time of loading.



Potatoes	<u>SUPPLY</u> FAIR <u>QUALITY</u> GOOD	Demand is solid with good quality from all growing regions. The market is trending down as more growing areas begins to ship new crops. Idaho started with Reds, Yellows, and Russets. Washington is shipping new crops with size primarily small with few 40-60ct. Michigan and Wisconsin new crops are starting soon. San Luis Valley new crop usually starts early September. Expecting better yields this year due to more acreage compared to last few years. This will also affect precut.
MARKET ALERT Squash	<u>Supply</u> Fair <u>Quality</u> Fair	Prices for Yellow and Zucchini Squash are trending up. Growing areas in the Northeast are reporting cooler weather. Production out of the East is working its way South. Georgia was impacted by Hurricane Idalia. Look for the markets to be unstable during the weeks to come.
Strawberries	<u>SUPPLY</u> GOOD <u>QUALITY</u> FAIR	Prices for Strawberries are trending down. California experienced some heat this week and fruit is coming on faster than forecasted. Growers are working hard to remove any fruit that has poor quality.
MARKET ALERT Tomatoes	<u>Supply</u> Fair <u>Quality</u> Fair	ALERT (Cherry & Grape) Tomato prices are mixed. The impact on the markets from Hurricane Idalia is unknown. The market should find their footing next week. The Grape Tomato market is off a little but is still extremely tight. Production has been impacted by heat and hurricane in the East plus the recent hurricane out West. Supplies out of the East were already tight.
Watermelons	<u>SUPPLY</u> GOOD <u>QUALITY</u> GOOD	Supplies are good. Supplies are available in Central and Southern California, Delaware, Indiana, Missouri, North Carolina, Oregon, Texas, and Washington. Limited supplies in Texas.





### Produce Category Overview

The impact on the market from Hurricane Idalia is unknown. The commodities that may be impacted are corn, cucumbers, bell peppers, hot peppers, squash, and tomatoes.

Asparagus are extremely limited on Large, Jumbo, and XL. Avocados are limited on 48s and larger due to weather. Blackberries and Raspberries have limited supplies. Brussels Sprouts are slightly better but remain escalated. Chili Peppers remain tight due to the weather. Grapes have been impacted and reduced by 30% due to the recent Hurricane in the west, causing a possible gap before offshore is available in at the end of the year. Iceberg Lettuce is light in weight with undersized head. Good time to promote Broccolini, Carrots, Cauliflowers, Celery, Iceberg, Green and Red Leaf Lettuce, Kale, and Romaine.

### Supermarkets ask: Dine in, carry out or delivery?

Wander through some grocery stores and you feel as if you're in a buffet, fast-casual restaurant or food court. The chefhelmed delis and salad bars tempt shoppers to carry out some kale salad punctuated with pink pomegranate arils and pine nuts. The caramelized, crispy Brussels sprouts glisten with bacon, and the cold, crunchy broccoli salad is sweetened with raisins.

Meal kits are proliferating for shoppers who still want to cook but with shortcuts. In between, there are heat-and-eat options — sometimes delivered through a third-party app.

"When you go in a store, we're foodservice as well. You can sit down or carry out. We're trying to meet the customer where they want to be," said Steve Mayer, president of Bashas', based in Chandler, Ariz.

With the return of restaurants after tanking in 2020 and 2021, the competition has fired up in 2023 for grocery retailers trying to nab share of the consumer's 35 meals a week.

In total food and beverage sales, rising inflation increased the retail share in 2022, but foodservice improved in the first quarter of 2023, reported Circana, the consumer behavior analytics firm that merged IRI and NPD's retail-foodservice power.

Bashas' offers foods from popular local eateries, and it hired trend-focused chefs at AJ's, its gourmet banner, to meet the demand.

#### PRODUCE IN FOODSERVICE-ORIENTED RETAIL

As supermarkets transform at an ever-quickening pace, where does produce play a role?

International Fresh Produce Association's global Technomic data revealed 64% of consumers use foodservice in supermarkets a few times a month or more. Only 17% of consumers believe that fresh produce is not represented well in supermarket foodservice, but two-thirds of shoppers want more prepared options that are healthful, as well as more heat-and-eat vegetables, side dishes and globally inspired choices...
